| JOHN POYNET, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER. The Office of Prelate was discontinued by King Edward the Sixth, in March 1553, but was Revived in September in the same year, by Queen Mary. Died 11th April 1556. | <i>The See and Office were Vacant Thirteen Years.</i> |
| STEPHEN GARDINER, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER. Restored to that See in 1553. Died 12th November 1555. | BRIAN DUPPA, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER. Died 26th March 1662. |
| JOHN WHITE, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER. Deprived of the See in 1560. | GEORGE MORLEY, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER. Died 29th October 1684. |
| ROBERT HORNE, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER. Admitted as PRELATE in 1561. Died 1st June 1580. | PETER MEW, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER. Admitted as PRELATE 9th December 1684. Died 9th November 1706. |

SIR JONATHAN TRELAWNEY, BARONET, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER. Admitted as PRELATE 23rd June 1707. Died 19th July 1721.

CHARLES TRIMNELL, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER. Admitted as PRELATE 10th October 1722. Died 1723.

RICHARD WILLIS, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER, late CHANCELLOR of the Order. Admitted as PRELATE 9th July 1724. Died 10th August 1734.

BENJAMIN HOADLEY, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER, late CHANCELLOR of the Order. Admitted as PRELATE 20th February 1738. Died 17th April 1761.

JOHN THOMAS, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER, late CHANCELLOR of the Order. Admitted as PRELATE 27th May 1762. Died May 1781.

THE HONOURABLE BROWNLOW NORTH, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER. Admitted as PRELATE 19th April 1782. Died 12th July 1820.

GEORGE PRETYMAN TOMLINE, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER. Admitted as PRELATE 22nd July 1822. Died November 1827.

CHARLES RICHARD SUMNER, BISHOP OF WINCHESTER. Admitted as PRELATE 13th May 1829. THE PRESENT LORD BISHOP OF WINCHESTER, AND PRELATE OF THE ORDER OF THE GARTER.

CHANCELLORS OF THE ORDER.

[The custody of the Seal of the Order was originally entrusted to one of the Knights Companions; and in the 1st Henry VI. 1423, Sir John Robesart was styled "Custos Sigilli Ordinis," with the title of "Chancellor," (vide p. 435, ante,) though the Office was not expressly created until the reign of King Edward the Fourth, in 1475.]

RICHARD BEAUCHAMP, BISHOP OF SALISBURY AND DEAN OF WINDSOR. APPOINTED CHANCELLOR OF THE ORDER OF THE GARTER 10th October 1475. Died 1482.

LIONEL WYDEVILLE, BISHOP OF SALISBURY. Died 1485.

DOCTOR JOHN MORGAN, DEAN OF WINDSOR. Received Robes as CHANCELLOR OF THE ORDER in 1491. Became Bishop of St. David's in 1496. Died May 1504.

SIR CHARLES SOMERSET, EARL OF WORCESTER, the LORD CHAMBERLAIN, and one of the Companions of the Order, is stated to have been CHANCELLOR in August 1523.—(Vide pp. 133, 439, ante.) Died in 1526.

SIR WILLIAM CECIL, KNIGHT. Appointed CHANCELLOR in March, and his Patent dated in April 1553, but was deprived before September in that year (Fœdera, xv. 330).

SIR WILLIAM PETRE, KNIGHT, Principal Secretary of State. Appointed CHANCELLOR 27th September 1553. Died January 1572.

SIR THOMAS SMITH, KNIGHT, Principal Secretary of State. Appointed CHANCELLOR 25th April 1572 (Fœdera, xv. 707). Died 12th August 1577.

SIR FRANCIS WALSINGHAM, Principal Secretary of State. Appointed CHANCELLOR 22nd April 1578. He appears to have resigned the Chancellorship of the Order in 1588.

SIR AMIAS PAULET, KNIGHT, a Privy Counsellor. Appointed CHANCELLOR 22nd April 1588. Died September 1588.

SIR JOHN WOOLLEY, KNIGHT, Secretary for the Latin Tongue. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 23rd April 1589. Died February or March 1596.

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SIR EDWARD DYER, KNIGHT. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 23rd April 1596. Died 1608.

SIR JOHN HERBERT, KNIGHT, Principal Secretary of State. Appointed CHANCELLOR in 1608. Died 9th July 1617.

SIR GEORGE MORE, KNIGHT. Admitted as CHANCELLOR, according to some authorities, in 1610, but according to Ashmole (p. 521), in 1623. It would appear that he resigned the Office before September 1628. Died 15th October 1632.

SIR FRANCIS CRANE, KNIGHT. Sworn as CHANCELLOR at the Feast of St. George 1628. Died 26th June 1636.

SIR THOMAS ROE, KNIGHT. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 5th December 1636. Died about 1644.

SIR JAMES PALMER, KNIGHT AND BARONET. Appointed Deputy CHANCELLOR 4th, and sworn 20th May 1638, and sworn as CHANCELLOR 2nd March 1645. Died 1657.

SIR HENRY DE VIC, BARONET, Secretary for the French Tongue. Appointed CHANCELLOR September 1660, and sworn in April 1661. Died November 1671.

Sir Richard Fanshaw. Admitted as Deputy to the Chancellor 14th January 1661.

SETH WARD, BISHOP OF SALISBURY. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 25th November 1671. Died 6th January 1689.

GILBERT BURNET, BISHOP OF SALISBURY. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 3rd April 1689. Died March 1714.

WILLIAM TALBOT, BISHOP OF SALISBURY, 1715. Translated to Durham in 1722.

RICHARD WILLIS, BISHOP OF SALISBURY. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 10th October 1722. Translated to Winchester, and became PRELATE OF THE ORDER in 1723.

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BENJAMIN HOADLEY, BISHOP OF SALISBURY. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 26th May 1726. Translated to Winchester, and became PRELATE OF THE ORDER in 1734.

THOMAS SHERLOCK, BISHOP OF SALISBURY. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 20th February 1738. Translated to London in November 1748.

JOHN GILBERT, BISHOP OF SALISBURY. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 22nd June 1749. Translated to York in May 1757.

JOHN THOMAS, BISHOP OF SALISBURY. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 30th June 1757. Translated to Winchester, and became PRELATE OF THE ORDER in 1761.

HONOURABLE ROBERT DRUMMOND, BISHOP OF SALISBURY 1761. Translated to York in 1761.

JOHN THOMAS, BISHOP OF SALISBURY. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 22nd September 1762. Died 20th July 1766.

JOHN HUME, BISHOP OF SALISBURY. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 21st December 1767. Died June 1782.

HONOURABLE SHUTE BARRINGTON, BISHOP OF SALISBURY. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 3rd October 1782. Translated to Durham in 1791.

JOHN DOUGLAS, BISHOP OF SALISBURY, late Dean of Windsor and REGISTRAR. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 12th June 1793. Died May 1807.

JOHN FISHER, BISHOP OF SALISBURY. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 18th July 1807. Died May 1825.

THOMAS BURGESS, BISHOP OF SALISBURY. Admitted as CHANCELLOR 13th May 1829. Died 19th February 1837.

HONOURABLE RICHARD BAGOT, PRESENT LORD BISHOP OF OXFORD, and CHANCELLOR OF THE ORDER OF THE GARTER, to which Office he was Appointed on the 25th of February, and Admitted on the 17th March 1837.

REGISTRARS OF THE ORDER.

[The Names in the following List occur in Ashmole's Catalogue of the Registrars, which ends with Doctor Brune Ryves, except where this mark * is prefixed.]

JOHN CORINGHAM. Installed a CANON OF WINDSOR in 1414. He is supposed to have been REGISTRAR OF THE ORDER, and to have compiled the "Registrum Ordinis Chartaceum." Died 1445.

JOHN DEPEDEN. Installed a CANON OF WINDSOR in 1429. Appointed REGISTRAR in May 1446 (Vide Register, Anstis, II. 129).

JAMES† GOLDWELL. Installed a CANON OF WINDSOR in 1458. Appointed REGISTRAR in 1460. (Anstis, II. 168.) Elected Bishop of Norwich in 1472.

* THOMAS DANETT. Installed a CANON OF WINDSOR in 1471, and Dean in 1481. He was REGISTRAR in 1480 (Vide p. 487, *antea*). Died 1483.

OLIVER KING. Installed a CANON OF WINDSOR in 1481. Secretary to King Edward IV. and Henry VII. He was REGISTRAR in 1488 (Vide p. 109, *antea*). Elected Bishop of Salisbury in 1491.

RICHARD NIX or NIKKE. Installed a CANON OF WINDSOR in 1496. Elected Bishop of Norwich in 1501.

CHRISTOPHER URSWICK. Installed a CANON OF WINDSOR in November 1490, and as DEAN in 1495. Died 1505.

* THOMAS RUTHALL, DEAN OF SALISBURY. Secretary to King Henry VII. and Henry VIII. He appears to have been REGISTRAR for some time before his Election to the See of Durham in July 1509 (Vide Anstis, II. 272).

THOMAS WOLSEY, the King's Almoner. Appointed REGISTRAR in 1510 (Anstis, II. 272). Elected Bishop of Lincoln in February 1514, and Translated to York in September in the same year.

WILLIAM ATWATER. Installed a CANON OF WINDSOR in 1499. Elected Bishop of Lincoln in September 1514.

NICHOLAS WEST. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR in 1510. Elected Bishop of Ely in 1515.

JOHN VOSEY. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR in 1515. He was REGISTRAR in 1519 (Anstis, II. iv.) Elected Bishop of Exeter in the same year.

RICHARD SYDNOR. Installed a CANON OF WINDSOR in 1518. He was REGISTRAR in 1524 (Anstis, II. 366, 393). Died in 1534.

* RICHARD SAMPSON. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR in November 1523. He was certainly REGISTRAR in 1527,‡ though the Register (Anstis, II. 393) says, that Dr. Aldridge was the successor of Dr. Sydnor in 1534. Elected Bishop of Chichester in 1536.

† He is called Thomas Goldwell in the Register.—Anstis, II. 168.

‡ The Copy of the Statutes sent to Francis I. in 1527, were thus certified, "Collation faite a l'original par moy Greffier de l'Ordre Mours. Sainct George, R. Sampson."—Additional MS. 5712.

- ROBERT ALDRYDGE. Installed a CANON OF WINDSOR in May 1534. Admitted as REGISTRAR 27th May 1534 (Anstis, II. 393). He was the Compiler of the "Black Book," or Register of the Order. Elected Bishop of Carlisle July 1537.
- OWEN OGLETHORPE. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR in 1553. Appointed REGISTRAR 1st May 1555. (Fœdera, xv. 420). Became Bishop of Carlisle in 1556.
- JOHN BOXALL. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR in 1557. One of the two Principal Secretaries to the King and Queen. Appointed REGISTRAR 6th February 1558 (Patent dated 21st July 1558, Fœdera, xv. 609); but his Office and Deanery became Void by his refusing to take certain oaths in 1559.
- GEORGE CAREW. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR in 1559. Admitted as REGISTRAR 22nd April 1560. Patent dated 17th April 1561. Resigned the Deanery in 1572.
- WILLIAM DAY. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR in August 1572. He is said to have officiated as REGISTRAR without being sworn or admitted, but only by command. Elected Bishop of Winchester in 1595.
- ROBERT BENNET. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR in March 1595. Admitted as REGISTRAR 23rd April 1596. Appointed Bishop of Hereford in 1602.
- GILES THOMPSON. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR in March 1602. Elected Bishop of Gloucester in 1611, holding the Deanery in Commendam. Died 1612.
- ANTHONY MAXEY. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR June 1612. Died May 1618.
- MARC ANTONIO DE DOMINIS ARCHBISHOP OF SPALATO. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR May 1618. Admitted as REGISTRAR in 1620. Quitted the Deanery and England in 1622.
- HENRY BEAUMONT. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR May 1622. Died July 1627.
- MATTHEW WREN. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR July 1628. Admitted as REGISTRAR 23rd September 1628. Elected Bishop of Hereford in 1634.
- CHRISTOPHER WREN. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR April 1635, and appointed REGISTRAR on the 22nd of the same month. Died May 1658.
- BRUNO RYVES. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR September 1660. Admitted REGISTRAR 14th January 1661. Died July 1677.
- JOHN DURELL. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR July 1677. Admitted as REGISTRAR 9th November 1677. Died 8th June 1683.
- FRANCIS TURNER. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR July 1683. Admitted as REGISTRAR 11th December 1683. Elected Bishop of Rochester in the same year, but held the Deanery in Commendam until August 1684, when he was translated to the See of Ely.
- GREGORY HASCARD. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR in September 1684. Admitted as REGISTRAR 9th December 1684. Died 1708.
- THOMAS MANNINGHAM. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR in February 1708. Elected Bishop of Chichester in the following year.
- JOHN ROBINSON. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR in December 1709. Admitted as REGISTRAR 22nd March 1710. Elected Bishop of Bristol in November 1710, but held his Deanery in Commendam, until his translation to the See of London in March 1713.
- GEORGE VERNEY, 4th LORD WILLOUGHBY DE BROKE. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR in March 1714. Died December 1728.
- PENYSTON BOOTH. Installed DEAN OF WINDSOR 26th April 1729. Admitted as REGISTRAR 18th May 1730. Died September 1765.
- HONOURABLE FREDERICK KEPPEL, BISHOP OF EXETER. DEAN OF WINDSOR. Admitted as REGISTRAR 26th December 1765. Died December 1777.
- HONOURABLE JOHN HARLEY, DEAN OF WINDSOR. Admitted as REGISTRAR 3rd June 1778. Died January 1788.
- JOHN DOUGLAS, BISHOP OF CARLISLE, DEAN OF WINDSOR. Admitted as REGISTRAR 9th April 1788. Translated to the See of Salisbury in July 1791, and became CHANCELLOR OF THE ORDER.
- HONOURABLE JAMES CORNWALLIS, BISHOP OF LICHFIELD AND COVENTRY, DEAN OF WINDSOR. Admitted as REGISTRAR 12th June 1793. Succeeded as 4th EARL CORNWALLIS in August 1823.
- CHARLES MANNERS SUTTON, BISHOP OF NORWICH. Appointed DEAN OF WINDSOR in 1794. Admitted as REGISTRAR 2nd June 1797. Translated to the See of Canterbury in 1805.
- HONOURABLE EDWARD LEGGE. Appointed DEAN OF WINDSOR in February 1805. Admitted as REGISTRAR 23rd April 1805. Elected BISHOP OF OXFORD in 1815.
- HONOURABLE HENRY LEWIS HOBART. Appointed DEAN OF WINDSOR 6th April, and Admitted as REGISTRAR 23rd May 1816. THE PRESENT REGISTRAR OF THE ORDER.

SIR WILLIAM BRUGES, KNIGHT. Created GARTER KING OF ARMS OF THE ENGLISH, between May and September 1417. Died about March 1450.

JOHN SMERT. Appointed 3rd April 1450. Died 1478.

SIR JOHN WRYTHE, KNIGHT. Appointed 6th July 1478. Died April 1504.

SIR THOMAS WRYTHE, alias WRIOTHESLEY, KNIGHT. Appointed 26th January 1505. Died 24th November 1534.

THOMAS WALL, Esquire. Appointed 9th December 1534. Died 27th June 1536.

SIR CHRISTOPHER BARKER, KNIGHT OF THE BATH. Appointed 5th July 1536. Died 4th January 1550.

SIR GILBERT DETHICK, KNIGHT. Appointed 29th April 1550. Died 3rd October 1584.

SIR WILLIAM DETHICK, KNIGHT. Appointed 21st April 1586. Resigned in 1604.

SIR WILLIAM SEGAR, KNIGHT. Assumed the Office of GARTER under a signed Bill in January 1604, and Appointed 16th January 1607. Died 13th December 1633.

SIR JOHN BOROUGH, KNIGHT. Appointed 27th December 1633. Died 21st October 1643.

SIR HENRY ST. GEORGE, KNIGHT. Appointed April 1644. Died 5th November 1644.

SIR EDWARD WALKER, KNIGHT. Appointed 26th February and Admitted 2nd March 1645. Died 20th February 1677.

SIR WILLIAM DUGDALE. Appointed 26th April, and Admitted 1st June 1677. Died 10th February 1686.

John Dugdale. Admitted as Deputy to his father 9th December 1684.

SIR THOMAS ST. GEORGE. Appointed 12th March 1686. Admitted 21st April 1687. Died 6th March 1703.

SIR HENRY ST. GEORGE. Appointed 16th June, and Admitted 12th August 1703. Died 12th August 1715.

[During the dispute respecting the succession to the Office, between 1715 and 1719, Sir John Vanburgh, Clarenceux, was appointed to perform its duties.]

JOHN ANSTIS, Esq. Obtained a grant of the reversion of the Office 2nd April 1714. Admitted 29th April 1719. The learned Editor of the "Black Book," or Register of the Order. Died 4th March 1744.

JOHN ANSTIS, Junior, Esq. Obtained a concurrent Patent with his father in 1727. Admitted 18th May 1730. Died 5th December 1754.

STEPHEN MARTIN LEAKE, Esq. Appointed 19th December 1754. Admitted 18th November 1756. Died 24th March 1773.

SIR CHARLES TOWNELEY, KNIGHT. Appointed 27th April 1773. Died 7th June 1774.

THOMAS BROWNE, Esq. Appointed 15th August 1774. Admitted 3rd June 1778. Died 22nd February 1780.

RALPH BIGLAND, Esq. Appointed 2nd March 1780. Admitted 19th April 1782. Died 27th March 1784.

SIR ISAAC HEARD, KNIGHT. Appointed 1st May 1784. Admitted 2nd June 1786. Died 29th April 1822.

SIR GEORGE NAYLER, KNIGHT, K.H. Appointed 11th May 1822. Admitted 22nd July 1822. Died 28th October 1831.

SIR RALPH BIGLAND, KNIGHT. Appointed 26th November 1831. Invested 7th December 1831, and Admitted 13th August 1834. Died 14th July 1838.

SIR WILLIAM WOODS, KNIGHT, K.H. Admitted as Deputy Garter 13th August 1834. Appointed Garter 23rd July, Invested 15th August 1838, and Sworn in Chapter 17th April 1839. THE PRESENT GARTER PRINCIPAL KING OF ARMS.

ANTHONY KNYVET, Esq. Appointed 9th December 1536, but surrendered his Patent, and
SIR PHILIP HORY, KNIGHT, was appointed 3rd November 1543 (*Fœdera*, xv. 9). He also surrendered his Patent, and
JOHN NORRIS and WILLIAM NORRIS, Esquires, were Appointed 1st May 1554 (*Fœdera*, xv. 386).
* SIMON BOWYER.† Appointed 14th July 1493. (*Fœdera*, xvi. 210).
ANTHONY WINGFIELD, Esq. Admitted as USHER 23rd April 1591. Patent dated 28th May 1591 (*Fœdera*, xvi. 97). Died 1593.
SIR RICHARD CONINGSBYE, KNIGHT. Admitted as USHER 23rd April 1598. On the 17th October 1605, the Office was granted Jointly to the said Sir Richard Coningsby and GEORGE POLLARD, Esq. Pollard died before 29th April 1617 (*Fœdera*, xvii. 14).
JAMES MAXWELL, Esq. Obtained a reversionary grant of the Office 29th April 1617 (*Fœdera*, xvii. 14). Admitted as USHER in 1620, and held the Office in 1631 and 1642. Removed 2nd March 1645.
PETER NEWTON, Esq. Appointed 17th January 1641. Admitted 2nd March 1645. Died before 1660.
SIR JOHN AYTON, KNIGHT. Admitted as USHER 14th January 1660. Resigned in 1671.
SIR EDWARD CARTERET, KNIGHT. Appointed Assistant to Sir John Ayton 16th September 1661, and was admitted as USHER 28th May 1671.
